## Management Discussion of Fund Performance

The management discussion of fund performance for IA Clarington Target Click 2030 Fund (the "Fund") represents management's view of the significant factors and developments affecting the Fund's performance and outlook for the 6-month period ended September 30, 2023. IA Clarington Investments Inc. is the manager (the "Manager") of the Fund.

The Fund's Portfolio Manager is iA Global Asset Management Inc. ("iAGAM" or the "Portfolio Manager" or the "fund manager").

The Fund is closed to new investors. Investors who currently hold these series may purchase additional units.

## Results of Operations

The Fund's Net Assets decreased by 7.4% or \$0.5 million during the period, from \$6.8 million on March 31, 2023 to \$6.3 million on September 30, 2023. This change in Net Assets resulted from a decrease of \$0.1 million due to net redemptions, and a decrease of \$0.4 million due to investment operations, including market volatility, income and expense.

The average Net Asset Value of the Fund decreased by 5.8% or \$0.4 million in comparison to the prior period, from \$6.9 million to \$6.5 million. Average Net Asset Value influence revenue earned and expenses incurred by the Fund during the period.

Series A units of the Fund returned -5.7% for the six-month period ending September 30, 2023. The performance of the other series of the Fund is substantially similar, save for differences in fees and expense structure. Refer to the "Past Performance" section for performance information of each series.

The Fund's broad-based benchmark, the FTSE Canada All Government Bond Index, returned -5.4% for the same six-month period. The comparison to this broad-based index has been provided to help you understand the Fund's performance relative to the general performance of the Canadian bond market. The Fund's benchmark, which is composed of the 80% FTSE Canada All Government Bond Index, 20% MSCI World Index<sup>A</sup> (CAD), returned -3.7% for the same period. This comparison to Fund performance is more useful, because it more closely reflects the asset classes in which the Fund invests. The Fund's return calculation for all series includes fees and expenses, which are not applicable in generating a return for the benchmark.

The global economy surpassed forecasters' estimates and global markets have gradually turned more optimistic throughout the year, amid the dominant narrative that a recession can be avoided. Above-average inflation in food, gasoline, healthcare and shelter costs will inevitably lead to more consumer spending in nominal terms and fewer goods and services changing hands, which may lead to additional challenges to gross domestic product growth (Gross domestic product of GDP is the total dollar value of all goods and services a country produces over a specific time period).

The U.S. economy has remained stronger than expected and, despite some concern, there is recognition that certain data points are starting to show encouraging signs.

Canada's immigration policy has made its economy one of the most resilient among developed countries. Its current population growth rate is 3.1% year-over-year, the fastest pace since the baby boom of the 1950s and 1960s, which is almost entirely from international migration. This is, however, exacerbating some problems such as high housing costs, making it increasingly difficult for the Bank of Canada to fight inflation.

China's economic growth has disappointed since the economy reopened in January, and it has become evident that Chinese authorities appear more interested in implementing structural reforms than reaching aggressive short-term growth targets.

The European Central Bank has been dealing with persistent inflation that has fueled wage growth, while its main economic engine, Germany, may already be in a recession.

For the six months ended September 30, 2023, the S&P/TSX Composite Index, representing the Canadian equity market, returned -1.1%, with only the energy, healthcare and information technology sectors posting positive returns. Its U.S. counterpart, the S&P 500 Index, returned 5.1% (in Canadian dollars), led by the communication services, energy and information technology sectors. On the international equity front, The MSCI World Index and MSCI EAFE Index returned 3.0% and -1.4%, respectively, over the last six months in Canadian dollar terms.

In fixed-income markets, the FTSE Canada Universe Bond Index declined over the last two quarters. Rising interest rates affected longer-term bonds more significantly during the period, with the FTSE Canada Long Term Bond Index returning -8.9% compared to -0.9% for the FTSE Canada Short Term Bond Index.

Within equities, security selection contributed to performance over the past six months, as its only underlying equity fund, IA Clarington Global Equity Exposure Fund, outperformed on a relative basis during the period.

Similarly, security selection within the Fund's fixed-income sleeve contributed to performance, as the Fund is nearly fully invested in Ontario zero-coupon bonds, maturing in 2030, which performed better on a relative basis, as interest rates increased significantly during the period. This is due to their relatively lower duration (sensitivity to interest rates) and the inverse relationship between bond prices and interest rates. A Zero-coupon bond is a debt security that does not pay interest but instead trades at a deep discount, rendering a profit at maturity, when the bond is redeemed for its full face value.

Overall, the Fund's asset allocation detracted from relative performance. The Fund's underweight position in global equities detracted from performance, as equities outperformed fixed income during the period.

In order to honour its guarantees, the Fund is almost fully invested in zero-coupon bonds maturing in 2030. The remaining portion of the Fund is invested in a global equity fund and Treasury bills. The Fund's investment in global equities was reduced as part of a natural shift in the portfolio composition, in order to be better positioned to honour its guarantees for 2030.

New positions in the Fund included Canadian T-Bill zero-coupon bonds to replace other short-term instruments that had reached maturity during the past few months.

Decreased positions included IA Clarington Global Equity Exposure Fund, which was trimmed to shift the Fund's composition toward more provincial zero-coupon fixed-income securities maturing in 2030.

Eliminated positions included Canadian T-Bills that reached maturity in April 2023.

## Recent Developments

In the fund manager's view, the current economic conditions remain uncertain. The effects of historic monetary policy tightening will continue to work through the global economy and affect consumers and corporations alike. The fund manager expects these risks to remain over 2024. Monetary tightening refers to a central

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bank policy that seeks to dampen inflationary pressures by reducing access to credit through higher interest rates.

Effective April 1, 2023, the Portfolio Manager changed from Industrial Alliance Investment Management Inc. to iA Global Asset Management Inc.

## Related Party Transactions

The Portfolio Manager is affiliated with the Manager as they are both under common control of Industrial Alliance Insurance and Financial Services Inc. ("Industrial Alliance").

For the provision of management services, the Manager received management fees from the Fund, based on the average Net Asset Values of the respective series. The management fees paid are disclosed in the financial statements.

The Manager paid the operating expenses of the Fund (the "Operating Expenses") in exchange for the payment by the Fund of a fixed rate administration fee (the "Administration Fee") to the Manager with respect to each series of the Fund, except for Series I and Series V, if applicable.

The Manager pays the operating expenses of the Fund, other than Fund Costs, in exchange for the payment by the Fund of a fixed rate administration fee (the "Administration Fee") to the Manager with respect to each series of the Fund, except for Series I and Series V, if applicable. The expenses charged to the Fund in respect of the Administration Fee are disclosed in the Fund's financial statements. The Administration Fee is equal to a specified percentage of the net asset value of a series, calculated and paid in the same manner as the management fees for the Fund. The Fund's most recent simplified prospectus contains further details about the Administration Fee.

In addition to the Administration Fee, each series of the Fund is responsible for its proportionate share of certain other operating expenses ("Fund Costs"). Further details about Fund Costs can be found in the Fund's most recent simplified prospectus. The Manager, at its sole discretion, may waive or absorb a portion of a series' expenses. These waivers or absorptions may be terminated at any time without notice.

During the 6-month period ended September 30, 2023, the Fund did not pay brokerage commissions to iA Private Wealth Inc.

In order to avoid duplication of management fees, if a Fund invests directly in a Reference Fund managed by IA Clarington or an affiliate it may purchase Series I Securities (or the equivalent) of the Reference Fund and will not be charged a management fee or a fixed expense charge in respect of those securities. Alternatively, if Series I Securities (or the equivalent) are not purchased in these circumstances, we make sure that there is no duplication of management fees. In addition, if a Fund invests in another mutual fund, it will not pay duplicate sales charges or redemption fees with respect to the purchase or redemption by it of securities in the Reference Fund.

Certain of the Funds have established or may establish standard broker-dealer agreements with iA Private Wealth Inc., a subsidiary of Industrial Alliance and related company. Pursuant to applicable securities legislation, the Funds may rely on the standing instructions from the IRC with respect to one or more of the following transactions:

(a) trades in securities of iA Financial Corporation Inc.;

(b) investments in securities of issuers during, or for 60 days after, the period in which a related party dealer acts as an underwriter in the distribution of such securities;

(c) purchases or sales of securities of an issuer from or to another investment fund managed by IA Clarington.

The applicable standing instructions require that the above activities be conducted in accordance with IA Clarington policy and that IA Clarington advise the IRC of a material breach of any standing instruction. IA Clarington policy requires that an investment decision represents the business judgment of the portfolio manager, uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Funds.

- The annual Management Fees and Fixed Administration Fees, excluding HST, for the Fund were 2.25% for Series A and 1.21% for Series F.
- At its sole discretion, the Manager may have waived management fees or absorbed expenses of the Fund.
- The trading expense ratio represents total commissions incurred directly or indirectly by way of an underlying fund, as applicable, and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of the Fund's daily average NAV during the period.
- The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the fund manager manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher a Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the period. There is not necessarily a relationship or correlation between a high turnover rate and the performance of a Fund. The value of any trades to realign the Fund's portfolio after a fund merger, if any, is excluded from the portfolio turnover rate.

## Management Fees

Management fees paid by the Fund per series are based on applying the annual management fee rate per series to the daily average NAV of each series and are recorded on an accrual basis.

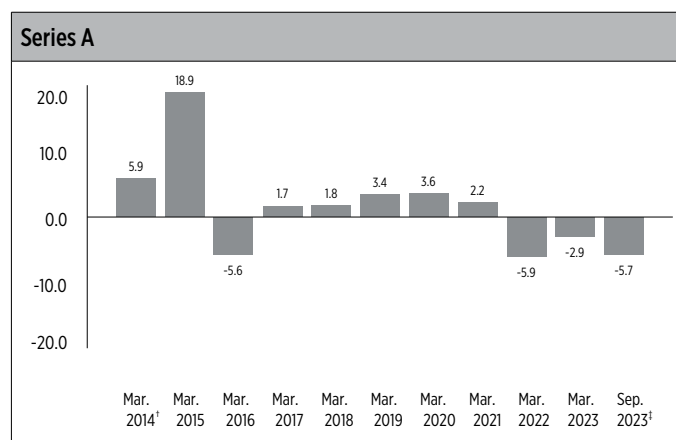

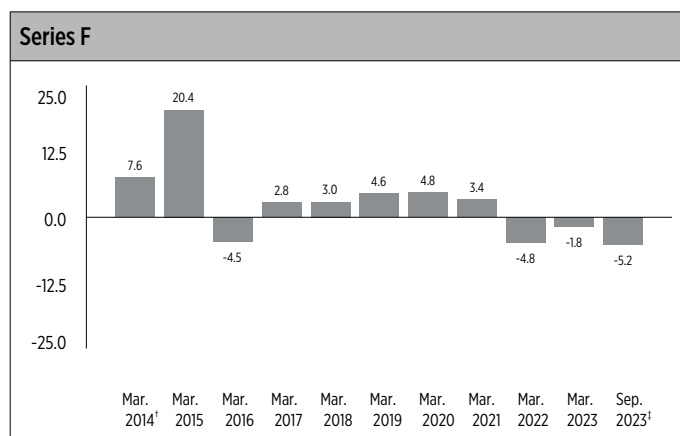
## Year-by-Year Returns
